

Education Assessment Supplements

What is it?

- A free, online assessment to help students be successful in school and college
- Four levels, three of which have a student version and a caregiver/educator version:

Level	Grades	Reading Level	Number of Items
Level I – Elementary School	4-5	3.1	88
Level II – Middle School	6-8	3.1	119
Level III – High School	9-12	3.8	123
Level IV – Postsecondary *(Student Version Only)*	2 & 4 year college, vocational & technical training	7.0	128

- 3 content sections tap into the domains of: School, Home, Community, Study Skills, Basic Skills, Technology Skills, Motivation, School Participation, Supports, Relationships, Goals, Plans for after High School, Students who have an IEP (Individualized Education Plan) and Students who have a 504 Plan
- Probes in math, reading, written language, technology, and transition planning
- Draws from literature on school-success, resiliency, and on educating youth from diverse cultural backgrounds
- Applicable for youth of all genders, races, ethnicities, and sexual orientations across the United States
- Confidential score reports available immediately

Who should use it, and when?

- Educators and caregivers, anytime, with all students in grades 4 and above
- Especially helpful with students who have risk factors related to school success

Why should this assessment be used?

- To help students achieve self-sufficiency and enhanced quality of life in adulthood by succeeding academically
- To serve as a “snapshot” of a student’s strengths, needs, and areas of concern for educational planning
- To inform conversations, counseling and formation of IEP’s and 504 Plans

Should this tool be administered alone, or with something else?

- Can be administered alone
- Can be administered in conjunction with other independent living assessment and training tools (e.g. the Life Skills Learning Plan) available at www.caseylifeskills.org
- Co-administration of the Education assessment and the general Ansell-Casey Life Skills Assessment (ACLSA) provides a more thorough picture of a person’s specific (education-related) and overall life skills preparation
